

Rubric for Scoring Shared Inquiry Participation (10 points possible per prompt)

Directions: Use the scoring rubric below to evaluate the overall effectiveness of individual participants' practice of shared inquiry in your group. You will also be given a chance to rate your own participation as well as provide a justification for your evaluation.

Response to prompt reflects understanding of readings. (3 points)	No connection or only minimal reference is made to one or more of the required readings. Response clearly and accurately reflects pertinent readings with an original application of the material to the case under study. Readings are referenced by author.
Response relates to current course content. (3 points)	No connection is made to the specific content under study.	Minimal reference is made to the content being discussed, OR connections to the content are not supported with sufficient detail to be defensible.	Response clearly and comprehensively relates to at least one aspect of the content being discussed.	Response clearly and comprehensively relates to multiple aspects of the content being discussed.
Response is articulated well. (2 points)	Response is difficult to understand due to troublesome word choice, structure, or lack of pertinent content.	Response is sufficiently clear and concise and main points of response are readily evident.	Response is an exceptionally easy to follow and understand.	
Response is made to participants' comments. (2 point)	No replies are made to others' comments, OR replies are insubstantial ("I agree" or merely a reiteration of someone else's argument).	At least one meaningful response is made to one other participant.	Replies are made to multiple responses from one or more participants.
